In May, 2007 Rachel Weisz filmed a special Mother's Day appeal for the World Food Programme, reminding us that many mothers and their children around the world live under the shadow of poverty and hunger.

Rachel Weisz is also one of the founding patrons of the Constant Gardener Trust, which is working to help lift people out of poverty in the places where the movie was filmed.
